Chris then talked about the relevant CWPMP for the Marina and RV Park which included the need for more water access and development of parks along the river to highlight the natural amenities the City has.



#### **Concept Plan Summary Report:**

#### 1. Outreach

- **a.** Park Master Plan 2021: the concept plans for both Hash Park and the Marina/RV Park began with community input garnered by the 2021 Park Master Plan process. This involved community surveys and stakeholder meetings.
- **b.** Elementary School Open House: On August 25, 2022, Parks and Recreation Staff garnered feedback on the Hash Park Master Plan at the McNary Elementary School Open House. The improvement most frequently voiced by participants was a desire for a splash pad at Hash Park. (see attachment for summary of feedback)
- c. Public Open House: On September 8, 2022 the Parks and Recreation Committee hosted an open house for the public to comment on the projects. Approximately 20 people attended the open house. Much of the public comment was supportive of the concept plans. There were many comments related to programming and operations. (see attached summary of feedback)
- **d. Online Engagement:** In addition to publicizing public meetings about the concept plans, staff gave citizens opportunities to provide feedback online in three ways
  - i. Concept plans were posted on Facebook with a link to give feedback,
  - **ii.** Past park and recreation program participants were emailed links to give feedback on the plans
  - **iii.** Moorage holders were sent links to give feedback on the Marina/RV Park concept plan.

Despite using a multi-pronged online engagement plan, the surveys only solicited four public comments (see attached)

**e. Moorage Holder Public Feedback:** The Marina/RV Park concept plan was presented to Moorage Holders on November 1, 2022. They provided valuable feedback that was incorporated in the staff recommendation below.

#### 2. Staff Recommendation

- **a.** Hash Park Concept Plan: After reviewing all the community feedback, staff recommends removing the community garden and replacing it with a splash pad. Staff recommends the playground area be reconfigured to place the shade structures in-between the playground and the splash pad to enable a seamless play space for both amenities.
- **b.** Marina/RV Park Concept Plan: Staff recommends the committee recommend City Council approve the plan with the following changes:
  - i. Add a second restroom in the marina parking lot on the east.
  - ii. Switch the uncovered dock at the end with the adjacent dock.
  - iii. Add as many large boat slips as possible on the northern end of the docks.
  - iv. Add reserved parking for slip holders along the boardwalk south of the docks.




## Umatilla Parks and Recreation Program Update Parks and Recreation Committee Meeting City Hall Council Chamber

#### **Fall Programs**

#### **Coyle Outside Survival Camp:**

On August 22<sup>nd,</sup> we invited Coyle Outside to come from Corvallis Oregon to teach a four-day kids survival camp. The camp was located at Hat Rock National Park. We filled the camp with fifteen kids and had a few on the waiting list. During the camp, the kids learned survival skills such as tracking, shelter building, cordage skills, fire starting and much more.



#### **Senior Kayaking Course:**



In Late August, early September, our Parks and Recreation team hosted a three-class senior kayaking series. The first classs started off with an introduction to

kayaking at our Marina Park beach, where our seniors learned the basics to kayaking.

The second class progressed to a trip to Warehouse Beach, where our seniors got the opportunity to paddle around on the Columbia River and learn more advanced paddling skills. Our third class was a kayaking trip from Warehouse beach to the Hat Rock boat launch. This was two-hour, three-mile trip.



#### **Kayaking Trip:**

Due to the popularity of our Senior Kayaking courses, we decided to host a Kayaking trip down the Columbia River. We opened the trip up to adults of all ages and the trip was a hit. We had sixteen spots available and the class filled up quickly. We took a five-mile trip from Hat Rock State Park down to the McNary Beach near the dam.



#### **Golf Scramble**



In mid-September the parks and Recreation team started a seven-week long Wednesday night nine-hole golf scramble. This was an event for golfers of all ages to come play in a weekly scramble. Over the course of seven weeks we had one hundred and seventy-six people attend the golf

scramble. This event was so popular the golfer wanted us to keep it going.

#### **Kids Bingo**

We kicked off our kid's Bingo nights in September and the popularity sky rocketed after the first bingo night. Parents were encouraged to participate with their children to make sure that bingo cards were marked accurately. To make sure all kids left with a prize we would repeat games to ensure as many bingo winners as possible were allowed for each bingo game. Our last kids' bingo night of the season will take place in November.





#### **Umatilla Parks and Recreation Disk Golf Tournament:**

On October 15<sup>th</sup> the Parks and Recreation Department put together an 18-hole disc golf tournament. The event was hosted at Umatilla Marina Park, we had the help of the Pendleton Disc Golf Club with designing the course and the tournament layout. The event brought in forty-seven contestants of all skill levels. We had contestants come from as far as Boise Idaho and Vancouver Washington.





#### **Cooking Class**

A series of 7 classes that covered and will cover, kitchen basics, corn chowder, stuffed chicken breast, thanksgiving meal prep (3 separate classes), and how to make tamales. Classes will continue through December. While participation started low class, sizes are increasing as the word spreads. The intention of the class was to have parents bring children to classes for a family class but interest has been higher with only adults. We expect the tamale making class to be the most successful.

#### Yoga

A weekly class offered weekly taught by a City employee who is also a certified Yoga Instructor, Carrie Shilhanek. Though interest in the class was good, actual participation was low. Classes will have to be adjusted to target a larger audience.

#### **Scary Movie Night for Adults**

The movie was determined through an online vote and only those who were registered for the event were allowed to vote. We played Jeepers Creepers and offered concessions at the Umatilla Golf Course. Overall a successful event with a slight hick-up getting the movie to play audio. The crowd was very understanding.



#### Trick-or-Treat on 6th

A 2-hour long event that took place on October 28<sup>th</sup> from 4:30 pm to 6:30 pm. The event included a business decorating contest, an Umatilla resident decorating contest, a pumpkin carving contest, and a costume contest. This year's theme at City Hall was Alice in Wonderland, and through collaboration of city hall employees, library staff, Public Works staff, and the Police Department the event came together nicely.

#### **Hocus Pocus Movie Night**

Originally scheduled for October 14<sup>th</sup> the event was rescheduled to October 29<sup>th</sup> due to changes in weather. Concessions were available and a costume contest for the entire family was also held during the event.

#### **Christmas Decorating Contest**

This year we will be having our first ever annual boat parade and RV decorating contest at the marina in festivities with the Winter Festival.





## Umatilla Parks and Recreation Program Update Big River Golf Course September/October 2022

**Tournaments/Events:** During September and November we hosted an Annual Family Reunion two-day event, a "movie in the park", a high school cross country event with over 300 runners, the Umatilla Heritage Museum Tournament, the Annual Sherrell Chevrolet Farm City Tournament, the Big River Ladies Club Closing scramble, 7 weeks of the Wednesday Scramble, finished the Men's League, hosted the HHS kids league for 8 weeks, and hosted three company outings.

**Customer Appreciation Event:** on Monday evening, October 10<sup>th</sup>, we hosted what will be an annual Customer Appreciation Evening. The event was catered with finger foods from GG's Smokehouse and was held in the Clubhouse. There were approximately 40 attendees at the event along with Gunner, Megan, pro shop staff, Salud, Chris, Scott, and Dave. Members were thanked for their patronage and then open discussion ensued regarding course feedback. Members offered suggestions and Dave discussed the intention of the City to host two musical festivals each year on the course in November and April, beginning October 2023.

**Membership Drive:** Our annual membership drive began October 1<sup>st</sup> and will continue throughout the end of the calendar year. A very large portion of our memberships will be purchased by November 15<sup>th</sup>, which is the deadline to receive the early payment discount. During the month of October, 50 memberships were purchased. Sixteen of those memberships are new, which means they didn't have a membership for the 2021 season.

**Pricing Changes:** A review of our pricing was done and changes were made to both daily and yearly fees. Yearly rate increases have not caused criticism amongst members that I have heard. Daily rates changes will go into effect during the 2023 season, and will apply after we change to summer rates following our winter season.

**November/December Upcoming:** Winter weather brings changes to the golf course. We will now be on a permanent frost delay until Spring which means the course will be unplayable until staff releases golfers to start. They are unable to play on their own without first being released to protect the course from damage. We will also be open shorter hours due to daylight that comes along with the time change. Our last tournament of the year, HHS Turkey Shoot, will be held Saturday, November 19<sup>th</sup>. November and December will bring significant special orders as customers spend their accrued book money and order gifts for the holidays. We will also be returning all floored inventory for a refund and setting up pre-books for next years inventory.

#### **Music Festivals:**

#### 1. Rock the Locks Music Festival:

a. The Parks and Recreation department is heavily involved in planning a three-day music festival that will be held at the Big River golf course on October 6-8. The festival will feature rock bands. Camping and RV sites will be available at the golf course. Staff are currently working on selecting an event logo, building a website, and working on ticketing and camping registration software. The City has engaged a promoter to handle booking the bands and handling support logistics. This will be a large undertaking and all city staff will be engaged at some level in the planning and implementation of the festival.

#### 2. Spring Music Festival:

**a.** The City will be hosting a three-day spring music festival in April of 2024. This festival will feature blues and bluegrass music. The project will be similar to the fall festival.

#### **Community Gardens:**

For the Fiscal Year 2022/2023, the City budgeted startup money to begin a community garden program. The Parks and Recreation Department staff visited the Hermiston Community Garden and started meeting with community resources like the County Extension Office to begin to build support for the project. The preliminary phase of development will include identifying and evaluating potential sites. After the site(s) are selected, staff will work on a garden design and structure. This process will involve a steering committee of stakeholders and staff. The final phase will be implementation and construction.

#### **Parkland Donations:**

Parks and Recreation Staff is working with Community Development staff to receive two parkland donations in the South Hills neighborhood for future development. One parcel is  $11 \frac{1}{2}$  acres and the second is a small neighborhood park sized parcel. Staff is waiting for the appraisal of the property to complete the donation process.

#### **Grants & Projects:**

The City has numerous grants and projects related to parks in progress. As staff becomes more involved in these grants and projects, more comprehensive updates will be provided at future committee meetings. Some of the current grants and projects are listed below:
