Marina and RV Park Report

Marina

The Marina has had a busy summer. Our boat docks were utilized all season. We were constantly selling gas, bait and ice to all anglers.

With our Seaworthy checks, we flagged 15 boats that were out of compliance the spring. They were not seaworthy or in violation of our Marina lease agreement. The outcome of that, a moorage holder decided to release his slip and take is boat elsewhere. We are also working with 5 other moorage holders to comply with our lease agreement. The remaining moorage holders are now in compliance. We had electric issues with C dock. Even though we had problems, C dock booked up in the summer. We are expecting to get the electricity back up and running on the dock by December.

I am happy to report that the milfoil was not a problem this year. The treatment that was applied worked great. We had no complaints.

RV Park,

The RV Park had another fabulous season as well. We increased RV campsites rates on July 1st. They went up from \$40 to \$46. Even with the rate increase every weekend in May through October we were sold out of RV campsites and occasionally we sold out of dry camping as well.

Our Winter long term started October 1st. We are at capacity at the moment and we have started a waiting list. With the electrical issues we had last winter, we decided to play it safe and only reserve every other RV site from 14-20 for our winter long term guests. We would benefit in upgrading our electric panels and add 50 AMP RV connections sooner than later. As they would also be beneficial in the summer.

Landing Days was a great success for the park. The RV park was completely book and I am happy to report that we are completely booked for next year as well.

For Rock the Locks the RV park was completely booked and we have started taking reservations for next year. We got complements on the shuttle and how grateful our guests were to have this service.

With having coverage at the marina, I was able to help with sponsorship for Landing Days and Rock the Locks. Moving forward I hope I can continue helping out with the sponsorship for both events.

We will also be hosting the 8th annual Fish N the Brave at the Marina on Saturday, November 11th. Tony Fisher reported a total of 32 captains signed up to help take 120 Veterans out to fish this year. This is a great event year after year, it seems that all Veterans that sign up to go fishing enjoy being part of this fabulous event.

Boyd's Place,

Boyd's house has been reserved for 74 nights, from July through the end of December. We Also have a few reservations for next year already.

The Umatilla Marina and RV Park looks forward to servicing the needs of the community.



Umatilla Parks and Recreation Program Update Big River Golf Course July/October 2023

Tournaments/Events: From July through October we hosted an Annual Family Reunion two-day event, a week-long junior camp with tournament, nine additional tournaments including two 2-day events, finished the Men's League including the playoffs, finished the ladies league including their closing scramble, hosted the HHS kids league for 8 weeks, hosted two company outings, and finished off with the Rock the Locks Music Festival the first weekend of October.

Rock the Locks Music Festival: The first annual RTL music festival was hosted at Big River Golf Course October 6-8th. Getting the course ready for the festival was a year long project for the maintenance crew, City staff, and the prison workers who came in to help with manual labor. The golf course involvement mainly consisted of infrastructure for the event, not planning, and easing concerns of members and guests that frequent the course. Initially, the event was met with much hesitation and resistance. Members got resigned to the idea of the festival and then waited on the outcome before judging. The overwhelming response from golfers was that the course held up much better than expected and the event went smoother than anticipated. The beautiful weather, and smaller than expected crowd helped contribute to the course handling the event. However, with more preparation time and knowledge moving forward, the course will continue to be prepared to host the event even in less than ideal conditions. The maintenance staff did an incredible job prepping the ground for the event. The irrigation and seeding came in perfectly, resisted damage, and looked amazing. Members and guests appreciate the roughs no longer being "rough" and realize that the concert prep also benefits them year-round.

Membership Drive: Our annual membership drive began October 26th. It normally begins the first of October and the early discount ends November 15th, however, with the RTL festival our pricing meeting was delayed. A few perks have been added to the annual memberships and we are also running to promotions to help drive in additional members this year. All individuals purchasing an annual membership for 2024 will receive 3-18 hole round guest passes to be used for non-member guests during the calendar year as well as one free general admission pass to RTL 2024 and the ability to purchase up to 3 more at 50% off. For the 2024 season, we also started a referral program which will give new and existing members a \$100 discount on their memberships by bringing in a new annual member who hadn't been one in the previous two seasons. There is no limit on the number of referrals a member can have although a member will not receive a payment. A free membership with 10 referrals is the limit in terms of credits received. We also chose to do a Get-Back-To-The -Game promo inviting ex-annual members back and offering a 25% discount for signing back up. With the new membership benefits and the incentive programs, we are hoping to see a significant increase in annual memberships this year. A very large portion of our memberships will be purchased by November 15th, which is the deadline to receive the early payment discount, so we will have a busy next two weeks with sign-ups. During the last six days of October, 30 memberships were purchased. Eight of those memberships are new, which means they didn't have a membership for the 2023 season. All of the new members came in as part of the referral program although we only gave 6 discounts since two of the new members were juniors.

Pricing Changes: The decision to keep our rates the same for 2024 was made in mid-October. This applies for both annual fees and daily play. The only items that could change would be food and beverage items based on cost of product.

November/December Upcoming: We will be hosting our customer appreciation event on Wednesday evening, November 8th. The City will be providing pizza and non-alcoholic beverages and discussing the prior year as well as what is to come. This event is open to both members and non-members wishing to discuss thoughts and questions they may have as well as meet with City staff.

Winter weather brings changes to the golf course. We will now be on a permanent frost delay until Spring which means the course will be unplayable until staff releases golfers to start. They are unable to play on their own without first being released to protect the course from damage. We will also be open shorter hours due to daylight that comes along with the time change. Our last tournament of the year, HHS Turkey Shoot, will be held Saturday, November 18th. November and December will bring significant special orders as customers spend their accrued book money and order gifts for the holidays. We will also be returning all floored inventory for a refund and setting up pre-books for next years inventory.



Junior Golf Camp

The golf camp was a four-day event where we taught the junior golfers all three hitting techniques (driver, irons and putting). On the fourth day all junior golfers competed in a course modified golf tournament. The camp brought in 44 participants which maxed out our registration, we also had participant placed on a waiting list. Jr. Golf Camp was a very popular program with a lot of interest from our community.


Movie in the Park

The third class was a group excursion where
we took participants from Warehouse Beach
to Hat Rock State Park that focused on
navigating water ways using skills learned in
the previous classes and trip planning. We had
ten participants for the first two classes and a
total of fifteen participants on the final trip.

Umatilla Parks and Recreation Director's Report Parks and Recreation Committee Meeting July-November 2023

Staff Training:

Training is a key component to having a successful, high performing organization. In 2023 our staff received the following certifications and attended trainings:

- 1. Two staff became Certified Playground Safety Inspectors
- 2. Six staff received Kayak and Paddleboard Instructor certification
- 3. Four staff attended the National Recreation and Parks Association annual conference
- 4. Six staff attended the Oregon Recreation and Parks Association annual conference
- 5. One staff member received the Certified Parks and Recreation Executive certification

Mural Project:

The Nugent Park Mural Project was completed in September of 2023. Noemy Vega, Recreation Coordinator, worked with the artist to refine the proposal and get the project completed.

Rock the Locks:

A comprehensive Rock the Locks report was presented to City Council on November 7th. Thank you to the Parks and Recreation Committee members that helped with the Success Criteria work group. For a fist time event, it was very successful. Staff learned a lot and are already working on the 2024 event.

Community Gardens:

The City is planning to form a steering committee that will help keep the community garden progressing. The plan is to begin construction in the spring of 2024.

Marina & RV Park Development:

The City was awarded a \$118,000 OSMB grant to begin design and engineering for the Marina Development project.

Nugent Park Boat Launch and Parking Lot Improvements:

The City received a \$460,000 grant to complete the Nugent Park Boat Launch project. The project has reached 30% design review and will continue to move forward over the next two years.
